Tilian Partnership update

Our investigations into Tilian and them of us are progressing. The parent/ carer meetings went very well and the questions sent were answered in the meeting. I have attached the powerpoint which was used to this email, we hope it us useful for anyone who was not able to attend.

The guestions that were asked from the online forms and were answered at the meeting:

Which other schools are part of Tilian? Wilby, Orford, Old Newton, Rougham, Crawfords, Gislingham, Kersey, Bardwell, Ixworth and Palgrave C of E schools.

You have told us advantages in the letter but I wondered what disadvantages you would anticipate from this? There is a 1% difference to what comes out of the school budget, compared to what comes out from us to go to the LA at the moment. Once the decision has been made to join a MAT, there would be no backward step for the school to re-join the LA in the future.

The questions that were asked at the meeting and the answers:

What happens to the ethos of the school? The MAT is sensitive to the ethos and identity of the school and it is part of the scheme of delegation, that we will continue to have our own Governing body and they will ensure this is maintained so it is right for Bawdsey. (The Bawdsey vision and Tilian's vision is based on the same story from the Bible, of 'The good Samaritan', making lots of similarities with the two.)

What will the composition be for the local school's governing body? The same as now.

Do complaints go to the MAT or the school? The complaints go the same way through the school's complaints policy. Tilian help if the complaint is about the Headteacher, or the school asks for assistance.

What happens to policies if we join Tilian? Statutory ones Tilian creates for all the schools, policies affecting the school are still decided on by the school. For example, the anti-bullying, behaviour and homework

policy will still be produced and decided on by the school and the school Governors.

Can the school still liaise with the local schools? Yes, and they are encouraged to. Tilian wants the best for the children and the transition opportunities we can set up locally.

Are there any high schools within Tilian? No as it would then be a high school led MAT and Tilian was made for and is led by primary schools; smaller, church of England ones in particular.

Does Ofsted still happen? Yes, but a lot of additional Tilian support is given to the school staff when this happens.

What advantages are there with Tilian? They have been running for seven years and have been successful in supporting their schools. The school maintains autonomy of the school and Tilian supports them to be successful. Tilian has a good school improvement offer and additional support to offer.

Is there autonomy in the back office (finance etc)? Through the scheme of delegation, the local governors control the budget, no budget or savings are taken from the school except the customary % we give to the LA and a further 1%. When the budget is set by the school and local governors, then Tilian will check the budget and reasoning behind the decisions.

A few other things that people who attended found reassuring:

- ✓ Tilian have stated that they 'make decisions based on what is best for all our children in the long term.'
- \checkmark They pride themselves on their integrity and honesty and 'what you see is what you get'.
